<p><b>Measuring</b></p> <p>Make your own rain gauge using a plastic bottle and measure how much rain falls in a week.</p> <p>Challenge! Can you draw a table or graph to show your results for each day?</p> 	<p><b>Geography</b></p> <p>Imagine the birds eye view of a place you know well.</p> <p>Draw a map of it.</p> 	<p><b>Library</b></p> <p>Visit the local library and find a non-fiction book about things that fly.</p> <p>Choose one thing and create a fact file about it.</p> 	<p><b>Research</b></p> <p>Research about your favourite bird. You could write a list of facts or make an information poster to show what you have found out.</p> 
<p><b>Art and Design</b></p> <p>Make a model of a machine that flies. You could use playdough, junk modelling etc. Bring it into school or take a photograph and stick it in your homework book.</p>	<p><b>Money</b></p> <p>How many ways can you make 20p using different coins?</p> <p>Draw or list the different ways in your homework book.</p> 	<p><b>Online</b></p> <p>Complete your 2Do on Purple Mash online. You have a word activity and a number activity.</p> 	<p><b>Poetry</b></p> <p>Write a poem (or a song) about things that fly...</p> 
<p><b>Creative</b></p> <p>Design a new type of flying machine. You could draw or paint it and explain how it works in writing.</p> 	<p><b>Science</b></p> <p>Research and draw creatures that fly.</p> <p>Challenge! Can you find one example each of a carnivore (meat eater), a herbivore (plant eater) and an omnivore (eats plants and meat)?</p> 	<p><b>Story Writing</b></p> <p>Write a story entitled, 'The day I could fly...'</p> <p>Remember to include: how you could fly; where you went; what you saw; how you felt.</p> <p>Use lots of lovely adjectives (describing words)</p>	<p>This is a free choice activity. Tell us about something you've done or a visit you've been on etc. Present your homework in any way you choose e.g. make a book, PowerPoint, model, write a song etc.</p>
