GOVERNORS POLICY ON CHARGING AND REMISSION
FOR SCHOOL ACTIVITIES

The Governors recognise the valuable contribution that the wide range of additional activities, including educational visits, clubs, visits from theatre/music groups can make towards pupils' personal and social enjoyment and achievement.

The Governors aim to promote and provide such activities both as part of a broad curriculum for the pupils of the school and as additional activities.

The Governors endorse the principle that the school's curriculum should be available to every child and that his/her access to it should not be limited by the imposition of charges.

1. For any activities where charges cannot be made, the school will ask for voluntary contributions. The Headteacher will have the authority from the governors to determine whether any such activity will take place or continue. If the cost of the activity cannot be met from voluntary contributions, then the activity may be cancelled. These contributions may be paid by instalments.
2. If any activity does take place, no child will be excluded if their parents are unable to contribute.
3. The school will charge for breakages or costs incurred by neglect or indiscipline. The replacement charge may be paid in instalments.

The Governors' policy has been kept as simple a statement as possible and may need to be reviewed from time to time.
